# **Best practice summary**

- First refugees arrived at the end of February 2022, peaking at around 500
- Help from Ukrainian-born Local resident
- Local emergency committee mobilized NGOs and Citizens
- The local library became an information centre for Ukrainian refugees + the place of their meetings
- Municipality offered food and necessities from its budget, active organizing role







#### Role of town

- Active organizing, mobilizing and leading role crisis committee
- Active financing
- Immediate help / place to stay was out of town





### Results after 18 months

- Around 500 refugees helped in various ways (cumulative no.)
- Around 30 children taking part in activities and workshops (cumulative)
- Communication tools established via FB pages Ukrajinci v Šamoríne a na okoli (389 followers)







#### **Methods of funding**

- Voluntary work NGOs, volunteers
- Active role of municipality 7200 Eur spent till June 22
- Community help, public gathering
- NGO grants especially national-level organizations

#### **Excellent elements**

- Greatly effective crisis committee of town
- Volunteers involved
- Public place used for gatherings
- Communication: FB page Ukrajinci v Šamoríne a na okolí (bilingual)





## **Activities**

- Workshops for children and their families
- Infopoint (Library)
- Language courses
- State help (schooling, accommodation)
- Currently 136 persons registered in town integrated
